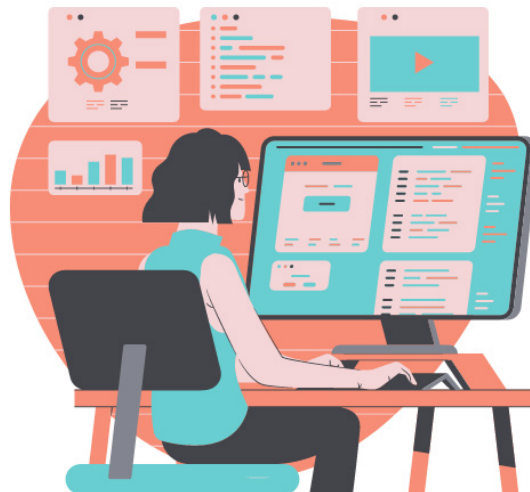
Student Leader Expectations
